## A few words from Marcus

"Those who sow in tears shall reap with shouts of joy! He who goes out weeping, bearing the seed for sowing, shall come home with shouts of joy, bringing his sheaves with him." Psalm 126:5-6

Scripture tells us that God collects two things, that at least two aspects of my life are eternal. 1) God collects my tears. And 2) God collects my prayers, storing up every word I've ever whispered in conversation with him.

Psalm 56:8 says, "You keep track of all my sorrows. You have collected all my tears in your bottle." God's not merely bottling up my tears though. He also promises that when they touch the earth, they bring renewal. Every tear of mine that falls to the ground will grow the fruit of redemption. God bends history so that the moments of greatest pain become the moments of greatest redemption, twisting the story to be sure that the pain that I feel releases the power of new life and that the tears that I cry will become the foundation of a better world. I'm promised that a day is coming when the Father Himself will wipe every tear from my eyes. But until then I live on in an "in between" promise that my Father won't let a single one of my tears be wasted.

God also collects our prayers. In Revelation 5:8 we're offered a glimpse of the receiving end of our prayers. "The twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb. Each one had a harp and they were holding golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of God's people." This means that every prayer we've ever whispered, from the simplest throw-away request to the most heart-felt cry, God's collected it, like a parent collects artwork on the refrigerator. God has treasured up every prayer we've ever uttered, even the ones we've forgotten. And he's still weaving their fulfillment, bending history in the direction of a great "Yes!" to me and to you.

### Practicing the Way of Jesus Together as Family

Our Fall Kick-off will be August 21st. Each Wednesday, all of our age groups will be studying the Story of God and how we are all formed by it. SCHEDULING NOTE: The April "FCC Book Club" will meet on Thursday, May 2nd at 7pm to discuss the book Amazing Grace: The Life of John Newton and the Surprising Story Behind His Song. This book is the "surprising true story of John Newton, author of the song that has touched millions. A biography that reads like a novel, it reveals Newton's dramatic story of sin and salvation as a slave trader before his ultimate transformation to speaking out against the horror of slavery. His story speaks to the brokenness within us all and our need for God's amazing grace—and reveals the truth behind his song."

Also: our ongoing film series, **Meeting God in the Dark**, will not gather during May. We will be back together in the early Summer.

Looking for a good Summer Read? Here are a couple of recommendations that will complement your current journey with Jesus:

**Teach Your Children Well** by Sarah Cowan Johnson - Sometimes we mistakenly give the impression that discipleship is more of an "adult" concern, but I firmly believe that God's design has always been that the primary arena of our discipleship is in the home. This resource "unpacks how parents can have an active discipleship role in forming their children's faith, with age-appropriate insights and strategies for different developmental stages. She shows how we can identify God moments, facilitate spiritual encounters, clarify emerging beliefs, and encourage new faith habits in our children. Filled with exercises and activities for families to do together, this handbook is an essential resource for discipling children with confidence and creativity."

**Practicing the Way** by John Mark Comer - This book was one of my most anticipated reads of this year. I think Comer has done an incredible job of distilling the journey of discipleship - which he terms as "practicing the way of Jesus" - from a variety of leading spiritual authors and leaders. An easy read that will challenge you and change your walk with Jesus!

Based on this book, one new Discipleship Environment coming soon to our FCC Discipleship Pathway is **The Practicing the Way Course.** This opportunity is designed to be "an onramp to spiritual formation, exploring what it means to follow Jesus and laying the foundation for life of apprenticeship to him." Over eight sessions of teaching, guided conversation, and spiritual exercises we'll learn how to lay a foundation for lifelong apprenticeship to Jesus and explore how to follow Jesus in our busy, distracted, and increasingly secular culture. ## FCC MINISTRIES AND PARTNERSHIPS

FCC is a part of or partner with many ministry and social aid organizations locally and around the world.

As a church we host the **Community Dinner** in our kitchen each week and volunteers from FCC prepare and deliver that food once/month. Weekly the Community Dinner serves over 150 meals each week. We've been active for many years with **Operation Christmas Child** both in putting boxes together for kids around the globe and also serving as a center to receive boxes from other churches before they are sent on to a bigger center. FCC provides over half the backpacks in the community-wide **Backpacks** food program that delivers Kroger bags full of healthy snacks for kids in Woodford County weekly during the school year. Part of that ministry is purchasing that food, bagging them, and delivering them to local schools. Most years FCC does short-term mission trips to areas in the United States that need help after severe storms and/or international trips to Haiti. Our church facility also hosts **Mentors and Meals (M&Ms)**, a non-profit whose primary goal is to enhance academic achievement in middle school students utilizing high school mentors, college interns, and adult volunteers. They also provide a meal M-TH for students attending & the Wednesday meal is cooked by FCC volunteers. FCC and many of its members also support the Benevolence arm of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) **Week of Compassion**. You can learn a lot about WOC at weekofcompassion.org.

FCC also has a variety of ministry partners who we help primarily financial. We financially support:

- \*Mike and Breanna Reynolds and their ministry with China Outreach Ministries on the campus of the University of Tennessee.
- \*Assurance for Life, a Lexington non-profit that offers no-cost medical services, emotional support, and practical help to individuals facing unplanned and often crisis pregnancies.
- \*Natalie's Sisters, a Christian ministry that extends hope, support, and God's unconditional love to sexually exploited/sex trafficked women.
- \*Autumn Marshall and her ministry with 5 Star Global Ministry in Haiti where their vision is to empower families, caretakers, and locals to provide Christ-centered disability care while training and educating nationals to provide disability advocacy in under-developed countries.
- \*Stephanie Mosier and her ministry with the Miriam Center in Northwest Haiti Christian Mission. The Miriam Center is a special-needs orphanage and community center for Haitian children with severe disabilities.
- \*Alex Kelley and his ministry with InterVarsity Christian Fellowship on the campus of Eastern Kentucky University. IVCF is a vibrant campus ministry that establishes and advances witnessing communities of students and faculty.
- \*Anup and Darcy Rai and their ministry with World Gospel Mission in Bangkok, Thailand.
- \*Through a partnership with **Northwest Haiti Christian Mission** and the **Christian Church in Mayette, Haiti**, we sponsor the local primary school there paying for supplies and teacher salaries.
